The Tobacco Prevention Program had booths at the Levy County Fair (March 30-April 2) and the Cedar Key Arts Festival (April 8-9). This year the Arts Festival Board of Directors signed a tobacco free policy that includes not only smokeless tobacco and traditional tobacco products, but also Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems (ENDS) or e-cigarettes as well. The festival directors decided to establish two areas where tobacco use is permitted, away from festival participants. The partnership allocated \$1200 to the Arts Festival and was recognized as the “Art in the Park Sponsor.” The sponsorship included announcements about the tobacco free policy by the musicians in the park, signage to communicate the policy to festival attendees, and partnership recognition in the program guide and in all the festival advertisements. Overall, the event went very well and there were no problems with implementing the new policy.

The partnership also sponsored the Levy County Fair, which took place March 30 – April 2, for one thousand dollars, and as a part of this gold level sponsorship the partnership received recognition in the fair program and advertisements, banners at the fair, and we had free passes for partnership members and booth volunteers. This year, the Levy County Fair designated the tent areas as tobacco-free, which includes the creative arts tent, the livestock tent, the VIP tent, eating areas, and the main stage tent. The Fair Board is interested in passing a tobacco free fair policy for next year and they invited the partnership and SWAT to present at their annual board meeting this summer. They would like to see some sample policies from other tobacco free fairs in the state.

The 10th Annual Levy SWAT Summit will take place on May 10, 2017, and the school SWAT teams are busy preparing presentations to update their peers about their activities for this year, including those for Through With Chew Week and Kick Butts Day. The partnership and Tobacco Prevention Program will be recognizing the SWAT seniors and leaders at the SWAT Summit. Finally, there is a statewide SWAT meeting taking place on June 9th to 11th and Kristina is looking for two SWAT members who are interested in attending, and one of them should also be interested in running for the statewide Youth Advocacy Board.
